The East Kalyan Welfare Society is a registered Charitable Institution having Registered (Regn. No. MAH/509/THANE) under the Society's Act and Public Trust Act of Maharashtra State (F-432-Thane). The Society was formed in the year 1977. The main objective of the Society is the development in the field of Education in and around Kolsewadi, Kalyan (East), Dist. Thane, Maharashtra.

The East Kalyan Welfare Society started the Model English High School on 14th February 1977 and the first batch of students appeared S.S.C. Examination in 1988 and the result was quite appreciable. Since then, we are maintaining our results of SSC as one of the best in the locality. We started the Junior College of Science and Commerce during the year 1993 and the response of the students for admission was quite high. After passing the XII Std., our students had to depend on other degree colleges outside Kalyan East as there were no degree colleges in Kalyan East and it was the Society's unanimous desire to start, Degree College in the faculties of Science and Commerce in Kalyan East itself. Society's sole objective is the development of Education and it is prepared to undertake the expansion in the field of higher education. Accordingly, the Management has started degree college from the academic year 2002 - 03 with Science & Commerce faculties on permanently no-grant basis. Today we are having a student strength of more than 1350 Degree Section.

From the academic year 2006 - 07 college has introduced the new subject - Information Technology to Std. XI Science and Commerce. Similarly, keeping pace with changing academic scenario from academic year 2008 - 09 college introduced Computer Science and Electronics for the students of XI Science. In the academic year 2009 -10 College introduced B.M.S. in Degree College.

We have already installed a generator during the year 2009 to overcome the power shortage due to heavy load shedding.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

JUNIOR COLLEGE

As per the directives of Government of Maharashtra ADMISSIONS to class XI are "ONLINE" since 2009. Eligible student is required to register himself / herself for ONLINE admission. Government authorities allot the college to students. Once the college is allotted student is required to take admission within three days in the allotted college. If student fails he/she will be thrown out of admission process. Other details of admission are given in the booklet issued by Government of Maharashtra.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Any student who has passed the S.S.C. (Std. X) examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto by the Board is eligible for admission to the F.Y.J.C. (Std. XI) class.

2. A student who has passed an examination other than that conducted by the Maharashtra State Board will be admitted provisionally by the College. However, such students will have to obtain an 'Eligibility Certificate' from the Divisional Secretary, Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary, Mumbai and submit to the College. Documents to be submitted along with application for admission are as under:

- Original Mark Sheet along with two attested xerox copies of the qualifying examination.
- Original School Leaving Certificate with two attested xerox copy.

3. Original Caste Certificate along with one attested xerox copy if admission is being sought against particular category.

4. Original copies of necessary proof along with one xerox copy in case of any other reserved category such as freedom fighters, Govt. job transfers, ex-serviceman, handicapped etc.

5. Students belonging to reserve category and are seeking admission must produce scholarship form along with caste certificate issued by the competent authority of the Govt. of Maharashtra, failing which, their claim for admission will not be entertained under the specified category. In case of the student migrating from other States / Boards-claiming admission they will be given only if they submit Caste Validating Certificate from the Competent Authority of Maharashtra State.

Note: 1) All admissions are provisional until confirmed by the appropriate authorities.

2) Admissions can be cancelled only after due submission of prescribed application forms, available in the office.

3) Fees will be refunded as per rules.

4) All admissions are valid only for one academic year, subject to satisfactory attendance and separate application is required to be submitted by a student for each subsequent year of enrolment.

5) Students are advised to keep xerox copies of Mark Sheet and Leaving Certificate. Original Mark sheet will be returned only after verification, confirmation of admission.

EXAMINATION SCHEME:-

First Year Junior Class students will be required to appear for the following examinations during the year:

1. Two Unit Tests & Tutorials - 50 marks in each subject.
2. Terminal Examination - 50 marks in each subject conducted at the end of the first term.
3. Annual Examination - 100 marks in each subject conducted at the end of the second term.

Promotion to Std. XII will be determined on the basis of the average of the marks obtained by the students in the above examinations.

A student must secure a minimum of average 35 marks in each subject for passing the examination.

GRADING: Benefit of grading is of 15 marks and is to be given maximum in 3 subjects but not more than 10 in one subject.

Dates for submission of project for E.V.S. Inter-discipline.

- 20th - 30th November - Xlth 20th September

Student who fail to submit project will not be allowed to fill in examination form.

JUNIOR COLLEGE:

- a) It is mandatory for students to keep a minimum attendance of 75% of the lectures, practical and tutorials separately, falling which their terms will not be granted. Those who fail to get the terms granted will not be eligible to appear for the annual exams.

b) S.V.J.C. students are required to note that the H.S.C. examination forms are liable to be withdrawn, if they fail to maintain the minimum attendance condition.

c) Parents are requested to take special note of the mandatory condition of minimum attendance of their ward. Applications of leave of absence on account of bonafide illness or other reasons, deemed genuine by the Principal, should be submitted to the college office for consideration of absence. The decision of the Principal shall be final and binding in such matters.

RULES FOR REFUND OF FEES JUNIOR COLLEGE:

1. If a student informs the institution in writing before the commencement of the academic year that he/she wants to withdraw his/her admission for any reason the institution shall refund the tuition fee, term fee, Laboratory fees, Development fund in full. The admission fee will not be refunded.
2. If a student withdraws his / her admission after the commencement of the academic year, the institution shall retain the admission fee, term fee, laboratory fee in full and the proportionate amount of the tuition fee, till the end of one month in which the refund is claimed.
3. If a student withdraws his/her admission on the expiry of one month after the college commences, no fee will be refunded. Students who have cancelled their admission will get their refund only on the expiry of one month from the date of their cancellation.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FREE-SHIP:

When student is admitted in class XI in any specific category viz S.C., S.T. etc. concerned student will be required to fill in and submit Scholarship / Free-ship form within one month from the date of admission, if student fails to submit form he/she will be required to pay full fees as his/her admission will be treated under open category. When student is admitted under S.C., S.T. etc. category he/she will be required to open a bank account in 'CENTRAL BANK OF INDIA' Kalyan East branch, Govt. will deposit directly amount of Scholarship due in their individual bank account.

DEGREE COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCEDURE ELIGIBILITY:

For admission to first year B.Sc./B.Com. the students should have passed the H.S.C. Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent with subjects as may be prescribed by the University.

Students passing an examination other than H.S.C. of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education, migrating from other States will be admitted only on production of a Provisional Eligibility Certificate issued by the University of Mumbai. Such students must submit:

1. Migration Certificate.
2. Statement of Marks & passing certificate original with true copies.

DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED:

1. For admission to First Year Science/Commerce, the student must submit original-mark sheet along with two attested Xerox copies of the H.S.C. Examination.
2. Enrollment Form duly filled.
3. Students migrating from other Colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai must submit a 'No Objection Certificate' from the Principal of the previous college attended.

From the academic year 2011-2012 University of Mumbai has introduced Semester System for Degree of Commerce. There will be total six semesters in three years. From the year 2011-12 it will be introduced in F.Y. B.Com. and thereafter in S.Y. & T.Y. B.Com.

ELIGIBILITY NORMS TO APPEAR OR THE ADDITIONAL CLASS TEST OR ASSIGNMENT OR PROJECT FOR LEARNERS WHO REMAINED ABSENT.

- If the learner is absent on medical ground or for any reason / emergency beyond the control of the learner, the learner must apply to the Head of the institution giving the reason(s) for absence within 8 days of the conduct of the examination along with the necessary documents and testimonials.
- If the learner is absent for participation in inter-collegiate events, state or national or international level events. Training camp or coaching camp organized by authorized university or state or national or international bodies, NSS / NCC Events / Camps / cultural activities / sports activities / research festival or any other activities authenticated by the head of the institution, the head of the institution shall generally grant permission to the learner to appear for the additional class test or assignment.
- The head of the institution, on scrutiny of the documents and testimonials, may grant the permission to the learner to appear for the additional examination.....

CLASS TEST OR ASSIGNMENT FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT FOR COURSES.

- A learner who is absent for the class test and the assignment will be declared fail in the internal assessment scheme.
- A learner who is absent for one of the two class tests/ assignment as the case may be the learner will be allowed to appear for one additional class test/ one additional assignment and the internal assessment will be calculated as of 25 marks.

B. Semester End Examinations-75% IV (75 Marks)

- Duration - These examinations shall be of $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours duration
- Question paper pattern
 - There shall be five questions each of 15 marks.
 - All questions shall be compulsory with internal choice within the questions.
 - Question may be sub-divided into sub-questions a, b, and the allocation of marks depend on the weightage of the topic.

RESPONSIBILITY OF ASSESSMENT

The assessment of Part "A" and "B", i.e. Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination as mentioned above for their learners and issue the grade cards to them after the conversion of marks into the grade.

STANDARD OF PASSING

The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consist of internal assessment and semester end examination.

The learners shall obtain minimum of 40 % marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in the internal assessment and 40 % marks in Semester Examination (i.e. 30 out of 75) separately to pass the course and minimum of grade-D in the project component, wherever applicable to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the internal assessment and Semester End Examination.

CARRY FORWARD OF THE MARKS IN CASE IF THE LEARNER FAILS IN ONE OR MORE COURSES:

- 1) A learner who passes in the Internal Examination but fails in the Semester End Examination of the course shall be considered as ATKT. However his / her marks of the Internal Examinations shall be carried over and he / she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him / her on passing.
- 2) A learner who passes in the Semester End Examination but fails in the internal assessment of the course shall submit assignment of that course. However his / her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he / she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him / her on passing.
- 3) In case of learner who is submitting assignment, the assignment will be of 25 marks.

ALLOWED TO KEEP TERMS (ATKT):

- 1) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester - II irrespective of Number of courses of failure in the semester - I
- 2) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester - III if he/ she passes each of semester - I and Semester - II.

OR

- 1) A learner who fails in not more than four courses of semester - I and semester - II taken together with not more than two courses each in semester - I and II
- 2) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester - IV irrespective of Number of heads of failure in semester - III. However, the learner has to pass each course of semester - I and semester - II in order to appear for semester - IV.
- 3) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester - V if he / she passes semester - I, Semester -II, Semester -III and Semester -IV

OR

- 1) A learner shall pass semester I and Semester - II and fails in not more than four courses of semester - III and semester - IV taken together with not more than two courses each in semester - III and semester -IV
- 2) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester - VI irrespective of number of heads of failure in semester - V. However, the learner shall pass each course of semester - III and semester -IV in order to appear for semester -VI
- 3) The result of semester - V shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of semester - I, II, III, IV and V.

ADDITIONAL SEMESTER END EXAMINATION

EVALUATION OF PROJECTS (WHEREVER APPLICABLE)

- a. A learner who PASSES IN ALL THE COURSES BUT DOES NOT secure minimum grade of D in project as applicable has to resubmit a fresh project for evaluation till he/she secures a minimum of grade D. His/her marks in the theory Courses that the learner has passed will be carried forward and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.
- b. The evaluation of project and viva-voce examination shall be by awarding grade in the ten point scale as given in the grade point table.
- c. A learner shall have to obtain minimum of Grade D (or its equivalent marks) in project evaluation and viva voce taken together.

- The above guidelines are subject to change/modification as may be made by the University of Mumbai and intimated to the college time to time.

Scholarship and Free-ship

When student is admitted in F.Y.B.Com., B.Sc. C.S., IT, or B.M.S. in any specific category viz. S.C., ST, VJNT, SBC & OBC, etc. concerned student will be required to fill in and submit Scholarship / Free-ship form within one month from the date of admission. If student fails to submit above mentioned form he / she will be required to pay full fees as his / her admission will be treated under open category. When students submit scholarship / free-ship form, he / she will be required to open a bank account in Central Bank of India, Kalyan (E). Government will deposit directly amount of scholarship due to them in their individual bank account.

Student who apply for O.B.C. Scholarship / Free-ship will be required to pay 50% of the yearly total fees at the time of admission.

Note : (For Professional Courses caste validity certificate is compulsory.)

Refund of Fees (Degree Section)

Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission;

The candidates who have taken admission in undergraduate courses in Govt. College, in Government aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges and recognized institution may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

Note: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the courses includes the following:-

- 1) All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different faculties excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities.
- 2) The fees charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-Charge, disaster management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are non-refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- 3) Fee collected for identity Card and Library Card, Admission Form and Prospectus, enrollment and other course specific fee are not refundable after the commencement of the academic term.
- 4) All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation.

Provided that wherever admissions are made through centralized admission process for professional and /or for any other courses by other competent authorities, the Refund Rules are applicable if specified by such authorities (as per the rules of relevant agencies) for the 1st year admission, in case of admission to subsequent years of the course 0.2859 is applicable for cancellation of admission.

As per letter No.HRD 2008 (4/08) dtd 5th July 2008 from the Govt. of Maharashtra students applying for duplicate marksheet will have to produce and affidavit on stamp paper of Rs. 50/- and F.I.R. registered with police station along with necessary fees for duplicate mark-sheet.

STATUS OF ADMISSION:

All admissions are provisional until confirmed by the appropriate authorities. No admission will be regarded as proper unless it is granted by the Mumbai University.

All admissions are valid only for one academic year, subject to satisfactory attendance and separate application is required to be submitted by a student for each subsequent year of enrolment. It is observed that many students passing the H.S.C. (Std. XII). Examination seek admission to the F.Y. B.Sc. class as a stop-gap arrangement and keep trying for admission to the professional. Courses for which they require original statement of marks of H.S.C. Examination. The concerned students should note that their admission is liable to be cancelled if the original statement of marks of H.S.C. Examination is not submitted before the date that will be notified in due course of time. F.Y. Classes student must fill up and enrollment form of University of Mumbai before the due date that shall be announced by the college. The last date of accepting the enrollment form by the College office is 20th August. Students who fail to fill up the enrollment form, their admission will be treated as cancelled without any notice to such students.

Student who is studying in the 1st Term and is not interested to rejoin the college in the 2nd Term must inform the Principal in writing to this effect before 10th of Oct. of the year failing which they will be liable to pay fees for the 2nd Term.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSIONS:

Admission will be cancelled only on receipt of an application on the prescribed form available in the College office together with the original fee receipt.

DISCIPLINE:

Students are prohibited from doing anything inside or outside the college that will interfere with its orderly administration or affect its public image. No outside influence, political or any other should be brought into the college directly or indirectly. Students resorting to unfair means at the examination will be dealt in accordance with the provision of the Government of Maharashtra Act No. XXXI of 1982 and Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994.

All students are expected to observe rules and regulations currently in force to enable the smooth working of the College.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

- Students should always carry their valid College Identity Card whenever in college or representing the college at any other place. The card should be produced whenever demanded by any of the college staff.
- Mobile Phone is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- Students should not loiter in and around the college premises during the lectures.
- Students are directed not to bring any outsider to the college premises.
- Any one who violates the code of conduct will be severely dealt with accordingly.
- The decision taken by the College Principal in this respect shall be final and binding on the students.
- Government of Maharashtra has notified Ragging as a cognizable offence. Any one reported to be involved in any form of Ragging will be severely dealt with. Therefore all students are required to refrain from indulging in any form of ragging.
- Students should not collect any fund from class-mates or outsiders without the written permission of the Principal.
- Students should not organize picnics without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- Students should read the Notice Boards from time to time and take due note of the notifications.
- Students should take due care of the college property and help in keeping the college campus neat & clean. Any damage caused to college property shall be paid by the students.

- Students should note that smoking is strictly prohibited in the college campus. The financial help will be provided from the students Aid Fund created by the management for the benefit of needy poor students. Students are requested to take part in the various associations such as Planning Forum, Debating Associations and Science Association etc. Students must become members of at least one or two associations of their choice. This will facilitate all-round development of the students. National Service Scheme is an important activity which will improve student's personality /leadership quality. NSS volunteers are enrolled as per University guidelines. Awareness and sensitivity to social problems is built up through participation in the activities of this scheme.

BMS.

We have started the B.M.S. course during the year 2009-10. As per the requirement of the said course our students visit industries every year. Since 2012-13 this visit has been made optional.

LIBRARY:

A full fledged library brimming with books awaits the bookworms and open a new world of information and enlightenment. its spacious serene and cozy interiors are blessing to the students, who have the constraints of space at their homes. Separate reading rooms for girls and boys are maintained. Library is open from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm on all working days during the exam period.

1. Endorsement of L.C (Library Card - Tickets)

All Junior & Degree College students will be issued 2 Library Cards - tickets for home lending of books and one Library reference card to use reference resources of the library.

As the cards are meant for prolonged use they have to be maintained.

2. Rules regarding issuing and returning of books

The books issued for home reading should be returned within seven days. The students should return the book only on the date on which it is issued.

Books issued on the reference card should be returned before leaving the Library Hall. Books lying on the table for a long time will be taken away.

During the period of examination, text book will have to be returned next morning before 10.30 am. Otherwise the student will have to pay fine of Rs. 10 per day.

Students will have to compensate for loss of book by them, same copy of book should be replaced to the library. If exactly same copy is not available in market double the amount of cost of book should be paid to the Library.

If a reading material is not returned to the Library, the student may not get copy of his/her mark sheet from the college.

3. Library Fines:

A fine of Rs.5/- per day will be charged if a book is not returned within a given time. Students are advised to check the date of returning the book before leaving the counter. No complaint will be entertained later.

4. Library Rules:

Every student must submit his/her valid identity card /Library card at the entrance of the Library and reading room.

Pencil or ink making and writing on the library/books, cutting pages or pictures of books or any other way of mutilating the books will be breach of discipline. The last reader will be held responsible. Failing this last reader will be liable to a FINE.

The "Reference Books" Question Paper Sets, Dictionaries etc. will be issued for reference in the Reading Room only and on no account they should be taken out of the reading room.

Student must refrain from disturbing their Librarian of any loss damage to book borrowed by him / her on the Library card.

Any matter not covered by this rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal and College Librarian.

Students should not bring any precious things to the Library. If such things are lost, the library will not be responsible for it.

Students should maintain complete silence in the reading room.

Students should contact Librarian to solve their problems. They should not argue with the staff on duty.

Violation of these rules will be subjected to fine.

Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the library, failing which fine of Rs. 100/- will be charged.

Ex-student of the college will be allowed to make use of library only if accommodation is available. Three types of membership are available for Ex- and External students.

GYMKHANA

We have separate Gymkhana hall wherein provision of Table-Tennis, Carom and Chess has been made. We train our students in various other games including foot-ball, volley ball, Cricket, Athletics, Taek-Wan-Do and Bodybuilding.
